# PRIME MINISTER'S SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED TO NETBALL RECIPIENTS IN 2014

Congratulations to the following 2015 Tactix players; Bailey Mes, Erikana Pedersen, Anna Thompson and Zoe Walker on being awarded Prime Minister's scholarships.

These scholarships are awarded annually, to athletes across all codes who are in national teams and squads and compete internationally for New Zealand, from young up and comers to seasoned athletes. These scholarships are also available to international level coaches and officials. The scholarships provide access to up to \$10,000 per annum of tertiary study fees and a further \$2,000 for study assistance.

NM congratulates the teams for making the Finals and in particular St Margarets on their  $2^{nd}$  placing. Well done to Lily Marshall and Jess Prosser from St Margaret's in being named in the Tournament Selection and umpire Michelle Stagg from Marlborough being appointed to the final.

Mount Albert Grammar School finished as New Zealand Secondary School national champions for the third consecutive year, defeating first time finalist St Margaret's College team 41-26.

Christchurch school team St Margaret's College, earned their way into the final for the very first time in the tournament's history after finishing in 11<sup>th</sup> place in 2013. Under the watchful eye of coach Helen Bryant, the Christchurch side fought valiantly in the final against the more fancied MAGS side, and made sure they didn't go down without giving the match 100 percent effort.

St Margaret's College goal shooter Jessica Prosser has been the outstanding shooter of the tournament with shooting statistics averaging over 90 percent across the week.
