THE NEW JUNIOR NETBALL PROGRAMME

As announced in last month's newsletter, the new Junior Netball programme will replace Fun Ferns and Future Ferns and will be phased in over the next three years. We are keen to reiterate that the new Junior Netball programme is to be used exclusively by those Netball Centres seeking and wishing to retain endorsement. The new Junior Netball programme has been developed to ensure consistency of play, coaching and player welfare and provide a great introduction to Netball.

There has been considerable research, discussion and thought put into the development of the new Junior Netball programme which includes skill development and game time. The Junior Netball review reminded us that children are not mini adults and the new programme development considers the physical, cognitive and social ability of our junior players.

JUNIOR NETBALL CLIP

To support the roll out of the new Junior Netball programme, a promotional video clip has been filmed to provide the wider Netball community with a consistent message about why Junior Netball is changing. Working with the young players was gorgeous. When asked to shoot in the adult sized Netball goal a young player replied, "I can't, that is way too big!" reinforcing why the changes are being made.

Based at two venues, the programme is being delivered by the 15 trained Junior Co-ordinators and supported by the 69 trained Star Helpers. A wonderful success story and this is an extremely encouraging outcome for Hawkes Bay. Well Done.







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THE NEW JUNIOR NETBALL MODEL

Alongside the development of a programme that meets the needs of our junior players, NNZ has developed workshops for the Junior Co-ordinators, Coaches and Star Helpers to ensure everyone enjoys the programme. NNZ has taken on board the feedback from the community in the Junior Netball National Survey (2012) and has developed workshops and resources to help the coaches at this level whether they are experienced or just getting back into Netball through their children and just want to help out.

Other modules and workshops will be offered for Coaches wishing to attain the Foundation Coach Award.

NO UMPIRES????

How can you have a game with no umpires? During game time for Year 1-4 players, support and assistance I is achieved by having a person on court to help the players out. This keeps the game moving and limits the number of stoppages. A Year 3 coach from the Junior Netball Pilot said "I had watched Rippa Rugby and liked the way the coaches were on the field and involved – I was going to ask to allow this to happen in our Centre if this change hadn't been implemented". Other comments from the pilot highlighted that more assistance was needed at the start of the season but as the players improved and learnt more skills less support was necessary. By allowing the Junior Co-ordinators or Star Helpers and Year 3 & 4 coaches to support the game, means Centres do not need to find umpires for these grades.
