


# Zone - Player Participation 2012-2014











Reached conclusion and funding period ended.

Proven success; increase in Community Coach Awards and Centres with coach development plans in place.

Going forward; seek further funding opportunities to assist Centres in raising their capabilities in coach development.

### Regional Kiwisport Fund (NNZ MLTM and MTM)

Reached conclusion and funding period ended.

Proven success; increase and upskilling of mainly secondary school student coaches, teachers and parents attending these workshops.

Positive impact; participating secondary schools fielded more teams and players had better experiences with student coaches.

# UNISS

- Zone representation to support the UNISS organising committee with hosting this major event were Trish and Jan.
- Record number of teams entered; 114 teams.
- 1,400 Players, 125 umpires and 17 umpire coaching panel and 15 Tournament selectors and a small army of volunteers from Netball Waitakere.
- The Zone conducted a review of the selection



process and introduced new system in line with NNZ Emerging Talent Selection process. The number of tournament players identified was increased to reflect the increase in participation and to bring in line with the rest of NZ.

- In the process of conducting a review of this tournament, to date feedback has been very positive.
